The morning sessions will run from 9:00am-12:00pm. The afternoon sessions will run from 1:00pm-4:00pm. Before and aftercare will be provided from 7:30am-9:00am and 4:00pm-6:00pm at a rate of \$15/day or \$50/week per child. If enrollment allows, we will permit you to transfer your camp fee to a different week if the need arises. June camps fees are due by **June 1st** and July camp fees are due by **July 1st**.

For full day camps, lunch and a short recess will be from 12:00pm-1:00pm. Snacks and lunch must be brought from home.
