Classical Prep Summer Academy uses an online registration form and payment system. All courses must be paid for at the time of registration. Upon completion of registration, you will receive a confirmation by email.

Course offerings are grade specific. Please refer to each camp description for the appropriate information. <u>"Grade" refers to the grade your child **will be entering** for the 2020-21 school year.</u>

### Absences

If your child will be absent, please contact the school at (813) 803-7903 or email us at <u>summeracademy@classicalprep.org</u> as soon as possible.

### Illness or Injury

Classical Prep Summer Academy will contact parents/guardians if their child vomits, has a temperature of 99.5 degrees Fahrenheit or higher, or who appear otherwise ill to make arrangements for pick up. First aid procedures will be utilized in treating illness and injury. Children must be fever-free or symptom-free for 24 hours before returning to campus. If a parent cannot be reached, then the emergency contact(s) will be called.

In the event of an injury, families assume all risks and hazards incidental to participation in Classical Prep Summer Academy and do hereby release, absolve, indemnify, and agree to hold harmless Classical Preparatory School, nor any of the said persons be held financially responsible for any injury, illness or death as a direct or indirect result.

### **Emergency Card**

For the safety of your child, please fill out the Emergency Card on page 18 and turn it in the first day of your child's camp session. We ask that you provide us with at least two emergency contacts, other than the parent or legal guardian, in the event we cannot reach you.

### **Electronic Devices**

Electronic devices may not be used during Classical Prep Summer Academy. If one is brought in by a child, it will be kept in the front office and returned upon the child's departure at the end of the day.

### Lunch, Snacks, and Water Bottles

All students must bring a water bottle and healthy snack daily. In addition, students who attend for a full day should bring a lunch. Please label all of your child's belongings.

### **Drop Off and Pick Up Procedures**

<u>Drop Off:</u> On Mondays, you will need to park and check your child(ren) in at the Borealis building front porch. This is when you will turn in your emergency card, and receive your car ID for the week. For the rest of the week, you may stay in your vehicle and drop your child(ren) off in front of the Borealis building.

<u>Pick Up:</u> Students will be held in the Borealis prytaneum for dismissal at the end of their camp. Teachers will be at the carline to look at your car ID and call student names by walkie talkie.

### **Personal Property**

Any property or personal items brought on school property will be the sole responsibility of the child. Classical Prep will not be responsible for any loss or damage to such property or effects.

### **Dress Code**

Uniforms are not required for Summer Academy. However, children must be dressed appropriately for the activities they will be participating in.Sneakers or tennis shoes are the safest and most comfortable footwear for children. Weeks of June 15-19 AND June 22-26 Time: 9:00 am -12:00 pm Teacher: Mr. Davis Grades 5-8

Who doesn't love stories of gods, and heroines, and monsters? This course offers students a fast-paced, energetic introduction to Greek and Roman mythology, to Norse mythology, and to African mythologies too. We will read. We will draw. We will watch film clips, and as we do so, we will ask: what are myths for? What do they provide to storytellers and to listeners? Why do myths last?

#### <u>Civics</u>

Are you wondering what all of this election stuff is about? What is a caucus? Delegates- electoral college? Law-creation and the Supreme Court? We will learn all about that and more while watching it unfold this summer during election season! Each session will focus on a different aspect of the US Government. Students do not need to attend all of the sessions, but they will feed off of each other to provide a fuller understanding of the United States government.

Session I: The US Constitution as an evolving rulebook for our government and society. We will discuss the reasons for the decisions that were made in writing the Constitution and the system that resulted.

Week of June 8-12 Time: 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm Teacher: Mr. Paul Grades 5-8

Session II: We will discuss the current presidential election process. We will not discuss our personal opinions about the candidates. We will run a mock campaign so that students learn what is involved in becoming the president.

Week of June 15-19 Time: 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm Teacher: Mr. Paul Grades 5-8

Session III: We will discuss the law-creation process. Students will act as members of Congress to enact their own proposed laws.

Week of June 22-26 Time: 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm Teacher: Mr. Paul Grades 5-8

Session IV: We will discuss the Supreme Court and several of its landmark decisions that have shaped the United States. Students will serve as Supreme Court Justices and determine the constitutionality of some laws.
