The following are guidelines of actions and communications for our scholars as they navigate the adjustment to distance learning:

Scholars Should:

- Be respectful toward instructors and classmates.
- Use correct spelling and grammar, to the best of his/her ability.
- Use “chat” and “comment” features only as directed by the teacher.
- Regularly check classes for updated assignments, class discussions, study materials, etc.
- Communicate frequently with teachers.
- Watch videos as assigned by the teacher.
- Dress appropriately while on camera.
- Mute microphone while not talking.

Scholars Should Not:

- Interrupt instructors and/or classmates during live sessions.
- Be in a location with distracting background images or activities.
- Use slang or coarse language.
- Make unkind comments about others' contributions.
- Use "chat" or “comment” features for non-academic purposes (unless otherwise directed by the teacher).
