

What are the expectations for my child(ren) regarding work completion during distance learning?

Classical Prep has a very specific vision for our scholars. We strive to provide scholars with the tools to excel in higher education and to be moral and intellectual leaders in a self-governing society. To this end, we have established a comprehensive and rigorous curriculum that is well-suited to each grade level. However, due to the COVID-19 event of 2020, student learning at Classical Preparatory School has transitioned to a distance learning environment which brings with it a modified platform as well as an altered expectation for student workload. Our foremost priority is the overall well-being of our scholars and their families. We understand that many families are juggling personal and professional lives with the added duties of facilitating online learning for their children. We know that some families are dealing with first hand effects from this global pandemic.

In order to support families, we have differentiated between work that *must* be done and work that *may* be done by students on a weekly basis. Both attendance and grades will be based on completion of "must do" assignments. Individual families may decide whether or not to complete "may do" assignments. Although teachers will provide feedback to students on these assignments, they will **not** be counted for a grade or attendance. We are always looking for ways to continue learning and are eager to provide you with additional resources for scholars who are yearning for them! With all of this in mind, the adjusted required academic assignments are as follows:

Must Do's:

- Reading Class Assignments/Assessments (as specified by teacher)
 - Includes 20 minutes of reading per day
 - Reading Log, if applicable
- Math Class Assignments/Assessments (as specified by teacher)

May Do's:

- History
- Science
- Memory Work
- Literature

- Writing
- Grammar
- Specials (Art, Music, Library, PE)

 Any other work assigned that is not on the must do list.

Because grades will not be taken for these subjects, we are aware this will affect the way 4th Quarter report cards look.
