SUMMER ACADEMY TERMS

WELCOME TO CLASSICAL PREP SUMMER ACADEMY

Classical Prep Summer Academy is an exciting way to keep your child engaged this summer. Courses are taught by professional educators and coaches with small group sizes. We are looking forward to having your child with us this summer!

Classical Prep Summer Academy uses an online registration form and payment system. All courses must be paid for at the time of registration. Upon completion of registration, you will receive a confirmation by email.

Course offerings are grade-specific. Please refer to each camp description for the appropriate information. “Grade” refers to the grade your child **will be entering** for the 2021-22 school year.

Absences

Illness or Injury

Classical Prep Summer Academy will contact parents/guardians if their child vomits, has a temperature of 99.5 degrees Fahrenheit or higher, or who appears otherwise ill, to make arrangements for pick up. First aid procedures will be utilized in treating illness and injury. Children must be fever-free or symptom-free for 24 hours before returning to campus. If a parent cannot be reached, then the emergency contact(s) will be called.

In the event of an injury, families assume all risks and hazards incidental to participation in Classical Prep Summer Academy and do hereby release, absolve, indemnify, and agree to hold harmless Classical Preparatory School, nor any of the said persons be held financially responsible for any injury, illness or death as a direct or indirect result.

Emergency Card

For the safety of your child, please fill out the Emergency Card on page 9 and turn it in the first day of your child’s camp session. We ask that you provide us with at least two emergency contacts other than the parent or legal guardian in the event we cannot reach you.

Electronic Devices

Electronic devices may not be used during Classical Prep Summer Academy. If one is brought in by a child, it will be kept in the front office and returned upon the child’s departure at the end of the day.

Snacks and Water Bottles

All students must bring a water bottle and healthy snack daily. Please label all of your child’s belongings.

Drop Off and Pick Up Procedures

Drop Off: On Mondays, you will need to park and check your child(ren) in at the Borealis building front porch. This is when you will turn in your emergency card and receive your car ID for the week. For the rest of the week, you may stay in your vehicle and drop your child(ren) off in front of the Borealis building.

Pick Up: Students will be held in the Borealis Prytaneum for dismissal at the end of their camp. Teachers will be at the carline to look at your car ID and call student names by walkie-talkie.

Personal Property

Any property or personal items brought on school property will be the sole responsibility of the child. Classical Prep will not be responsible for any loss or damage to such property or effects.

Dress Code

Uniforms are not required for Summer Academy. However, children must be dressed appropriately for the activities in which they will participate. Sneakers or tennis shoes are the safest and most comfortable footwear for children. Flip-flops and backless shoes should not be worn. Please apply sunscreen daily to children before dropping them off.

Explorations in Dance builds on basic instruction taught in three dance disciplines: tap, ballet, and jazz. More complicated rhythm patterns and combinations help the older students conceive and develop different ways of moving. Working in different time signatures allows them to interpret movement style, according to music choice. Camp culminates in an in-class showcase. **Footwear: EITHER ballet or jazz shoes, and tap shoes (any color).** Students will need to wear comfortable clothing to move in, such as jazz pants, warm-up pants, or leggings, with a t-shirt. Lion Cub Cheer Camp

Chant; cheer; jump; no fear! Young cheerleaders will celebrate their CPS "Lion Pride" with a cheer camp designed for 1st-4th graders. Campers will learn motions and arm technique and placement, beginning cheerleading jumps, and introductory stunting based on safety. They will practice one exciting chant and one fun cheer! Basketball Basics

Players will be coached by a collegiate coach with 30 years experience who can positively communicate with the players to help them develop their skills. Players will strengthen fundamental ball control skills and improve on shooting form, defensive stance, passing, speed/agility, and overall game play. Skills will be assessed through competitive activities. Players will gain a better understanding of the game of basketball while growing in confidence and self-esteem. They will receive information about how nutrition, sleep, and lifestyle choices affect their physical abilities. All of this and having a great time, also!

Cycling: Maintenance, Safety, and Mad Skills

What can a bicycle teach your middle schooler? A lot, actually. Learning to maintain and safely use the things we own is an important step for middle schoolers to take. What better way to help them learn lessons in self reliance, responsibility, and care than with something they already love...their bike!

Over the course of three days we teach your child basic bicycle maintenance (flat tire repair, brakes, gears, chain), bicycle safety using a proven curriculum (traffic laws, helmets, lights and other predictable behaviors), and proper bicycle fit. Using a custom designed course around the school, your child will also learn critical bike handling skills designed to boost their confidence. A highly interactive experience, your child will be working on and riding actual bicycles - their own!

Bicycling is one of the best ways for kids to get their first taste of freedom. It's also a great way to get kids off their electronics and outside exploring, playing, and experiencing the joy of riding! Parents also know that doing so safely and responsibly is just as important as the experience itself.

This summer Classical Prep is offering a 3-day bicycle safety and riding skills camp that will teach your child (1 thru 4) critical bicycle safety rules, concepts, and handling skills. We will follow a proven bicycle safety curriculum that includes both off and on-bicycle elements. Off the bike, your child will learn simple hand signals, how to read common traffic signs, how to be sure they are seen, and much more. On their bike, they'll spend plenty of time practicing bike handling skills on a custom designed safety course in our Borealis parking lot.

Taught by our resident bike geek, Mr. Grantz spent over 20 years working in the international cycling industry before changing gears to become a science teacher. He has spent countless hours working directly with kids on bicycle safety throughout his career.

This camp will teach students grade 1 thru 4 bicycle basics, including bicycle safety (helmets, lights and other predictable behaviors), bicycle handling skills, and safety.
