1. Do you have new or worsening onset of any of the following symptoms?

- Fever (greater than 100.4) or chills
- New uncontrolled cough (if you have established chronic allergy or asthma, a change from your regular cough)
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

If <u>NO</u>, please continue to question number 2.

If **YES**, you cannot come on campus and are required to:

- Not return for at least ten days since symptoms first appeared,
 - o AND be fever free for at least 24 hours (without taking medication to reduce fever)
 - o *AND* have improvement in other symptoms (cough, shortness of breath).

2. Have you recently tested positive for COVID-19 or are waiting for test results due to your own illness?

If <u>NO</u>, you may visit school as planned.

If <u>YES</u>, visitors waiting for test results must remain home until results are available.

- If test result is **negative**, you can visit the school campus.
- If test result is **positive**, you cannot come on campus and are required to:
- Not return for at least ten days since symptoms first appeared,
 - o *AND* be fever free for at least 24 hours (without taking medication to reduce fever)
 - o *AND* have improvement in other symptoms (cough, shortness of breath).
