

Guests: Scholars are allowed to invite one (1) guest to attend the dance with them. All guests must currently be in 9th-12th grade. All non-CPS students must submit a "Non-CPS Student Event Attendee Approval" form seven (7) days prior to the dance to the Borealis front office. <u>CLICK HERE</u> to print the form.

<u>All scholars must follow the Formal Events Dress Code located on pages 45-46 of</u> <u>the Family Handbook.</u>

Formal Dress Code for Young Men:

- Dress slacks, button-down dress shirt, tie, and dress shoes required.
- A jacket is strongly recommended.
- All pants must be securely worn around the waist.

Dress Code for Young Women:

- Semi-formal attire or formal gowns or pantsuits.
- Dresses are to be no more than 3 inches above the knee (front and back) or 3 inches below the fingertips. This also applies to slits in dresses. Dress must also be at the appropriate length even if leggings are worn underneath the dress.

- Dress may not be extremely low-cut in the front or back. The front of the dress must not fall below the bra line; the back of the dress must not fall below the waist. The back of the dress must not be open past the back. Sides must be covered. No dresses are permitted that are open or sheer on the front or sides of the dress, unless the openness is covered by solid material.
- Dresses may not be extremely tight/form-fitting. Be aware of the material that gathers and rises when walking.
- If the dress/skirt has sheer material over the lining of the dress, then the lining of the dress must be no more than 2 inches above the knee (front and back). The sheer material is not what will be measured.

In addition, for both young men and young women:

- No "polo" style shirts or t-shirts
- No athletic shoes/sneakers
- No torn clothing
- No see-through clothing or clothing that shows midriff
- No khakis, jeans/denim, or cargo pants
- No shorts
- No hats or head covering such as bandanas or doo rags
- No Dresses with revealing cut-outs
- No Pants and top where the midriff is showing

All scholars:

If the attire is questionable, scholars are encouraged to show their evening wear to administrators beforehand to determine if it is event appropriate. The determination of the appropriateness of scholar dress and grooming shall rest with administration.

Scholars and their dates who are non-compliant with the dress code will not be admitted to the dance/event or will be escorted out of the event. No refunds will be given for event dress code infractions in which these scholars are asked to leave.



SPIRIT WEEK GUIDELINES

ITEMS THAT ARE NOT ALLOWED



No wigs or hair color allowed.



No full-face masks, masquerade masks, or face paint are allowed. Exception: Scholars may wear a small amount of face paint on Thursday (Classical Prep Spirit Day).



No elaborate or difficult-to-sit-in clothing is allowed. Scholars must be able to use the restroom without assistance. Costumes are not permitted.



No jeans, pants, or shorts with rips, frayed hems (or edges), or holes. Bottoms can be no shorter than three (3) inches above the knee.



No leggings, yoga pants, spandex, tights, or similar clothing.



No pajamas or costumes.



No hats, hooded clothing, or bandanas.



No crops tops or shirts that expose the belly button/skin when arms are raised.



No open toed shoes. No slippers or similar footwear such as Crocs or shoes without backs.
