### **PM2 Testing Window Grades 6-10**

Below is some important information and the scheduled assessment dates for the progress monitoring window 2 (PM2) 6th - 10th Grade Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (F.A.S.T.) statewide assessments that will be administered at Classical Prep in January.

It is Classical Prep's goal and intent to assess all scholars in a particular grade/course on the dates indicated below. Some scholars with assessment accommodations may not be able to test at the same time as the rest of their classmates, in order to best meet their individual needs during their test administration.

If alterations to this schedule have to be made due to unforeseen circumstances, an update to this post will be sent without delay, if possible, or will otherwise be communicated to the affected parents and scholars as soon as possible.

- 6th Grade:
  - 1/8 - F.A.S.T. ELA Reading (90 minutes)
  - 1/9 - F.A.S.T. Math (100 minutes)
    - This will include 6th graders who are taking 7th or 8th Grade Math courses.
- 7th Grade:
  - 1/12 - F.A.S.T. ELA Reading (90 minutes)
  - 1/13 - F.A.S.T. Math (100 minutes)
- 8th Grade:
  - 1/12 - F.A.S.T. ELA Reading (90 minutes)
  - 1/13 - F.A.S.T. Math (100 minutes)
- 9th Grade:
  - 1/14 - F.A.S.T. ELA Reading (90 minutes)
- 10th Grade:
  - 1/14 - F.A.S.T. ELA Reading (90 minutes)

## **Statewide Assessment Information**

All statewide assessments are adaptive and computer-based. The questions get less or more difficult depending on how a scholar responds, and each scholar will see different questions from a common item bank. For more information on the test design, please [CLICK HERE](#). No scholar will take more than one statewide assessment on the same day. Scholars taking the 6th - 10th grade F.A.S.T. assessments will be permitted to have additional time beyond the amount of time noted above, if they need it. All statewide assessments must be completed on the same day scholars begin working on them.

The F.A.S.T. Math assessment your child will take is based on the level of the Math course in which they are enrolled, not their enrolled grade level. For example, 6th graders who are enrolled in a 7th grade Math course will take the F.A.S.T. Math for 7th grade. Please note that scholars in 7th and 8th grade who are enrolled in Algebra 1 or Geometry will not take a F.A.S.T. Math assessment.

## **Statewide Assessment Practice Tests**

If you or your child would like to review the computer-based practice test at home, the practice tests and answer keys are available at <https://flfast.org/families.html>. No special login information is needed to access the practice tests, sample items, or answer keys.

## **Test Security & Policies for All Assessments**

Please review the following policies with your child before testing:


- **Electronic Devices** — Scholars are not permitted to have any electronic devices, including, but not limited to, cell phones, smartphones, and smartwatches, at any time during testing or during breaks (e.g., restroom), even if the devices are turned off or scholars do not use them. If your child is found with an electronic device or is found using Bluetooth/wireless headphones/earbuds during testing, their test will be invalidated.
- **Working Independently** — Scholars are responsible for doing their own work during the test and for protecting their answers from being seen by others. If scholars are caught cheating during testing, their tests will be invalidated. In addition, the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) employs Caveon Test Security to analyze scholars' test results to detect unusually similar answer patterns. Scholars' tests within a school that are found to have extremely similar answer patterns will be invalidated.

- **Leaving Campus** — If your child leaves campus after beginning but before completing a test session (e.g., for lunch, an appointment), they will not be allowed to return to that test session. If your child does not feel well on the day of testing, it would be best for them to wait and be tested on a make-up day, so they may do their best work when they are feeling better. Please, remember not to schedule appointments on testing days.
- **Testing Accommodations** — If your child has an Individual Education Plan (IEP), a Section 504 Plan, or is an English Language Learner (ELL) or a recently exited ELL (within the previous two school years), and you have questions about the accommodations they will be provided with during their assessment, please contact their caseworker via email or Ms. Stern at [rstern@classicalprep.org](mailto:rstern@classicalprep.org) to discuss your questions.
- **Calculator Policy** —
  - On the Grades 6 - 8 F.A.S.T. Math tests scholars may use a calculator that is built into the secure testing browser and which is programmed with all of the functions allowable on their test. Due to variations in which functions are permitted on the different tests, we ask that scholars not use their own hand-held calculators on the statewide assessments in order to avoid access to unauthorized functions that would result in their test scores becoming invalidated.
- **Testing Rules Acknowledgment** — All 6th - 12th grade statewide assessments include a Testing Rules Acknowledgment that reads: "I understand the testing rules that were just read to me. If I do not follow these rules, my test score may be invalidated." Prior to testing, test administrators read the rules to scholars, and scholars acknowledge that they understand the testing rules by clicking a checkbox beside the statement in the secure browser indicating they understand the testing rules.
- **Discussing Test Content after Testing** — The last portion of the 6th - 12th grade statewide assessment testing rules read to scholars before they click the box to accept the Testing Rules Acknowledgment states that "because the content of all statewide assessments is secure, scholars may not discuss or reveal details about the test content (including the passages, prompts, and writing responses) after the test.


This includes any type of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, or posting to social media sites." Please make sure your child understands this policy prior to testing and remind them that "discussing" test content includes any kind of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, posting to social media, or sharing online. While scholars may not share information about secure test content after testing, this policy is not intended to prevent children from discussing their testing experiences with their parents/families.

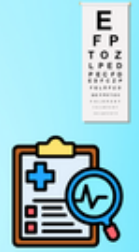
## **Thanksgiving Break 11/24-11/30**

# November Health Screening

## Important Information For 6th Grade



On **Monday, November 17th**, Classical Prep will conduct health screenings for scholars in **Kindergarten, 1st grade, 3rd grade, and 6th grade.**

The screening will include:

- Height
- Weight
- Vision
- Hearing
- Scoliosis (6th grade only)

**Important:** Scholars **cannot participate** in the health screening **unless the Parent/Guardian Consent Form (Student Bill of Rights) is completed.** Please ensure this form is submitted as soon as possible so your child does not miss out.

### **Steps to complete the form in MyStudent:**

- Log in to the MyStudent App.
- Click the Menu button (three lines in the top corner).
- Select Forms.
- Choose Parent/Guardian Consent Form (one form per student).
- Click Save on each form.

### **Semi-Formal Dress Code for Young Men:**

- Dress slacks (no jeans or patched pocket pants), collared dress shirt, dark socks, dress shoes (no sneakers or sandals), no dyed hair or hats.
- Boys may wear modest, professional ties without images or logos.
- Hair should be trimmed appropriately.

### **Semi-Formal Dress Code for Young Women:**

- Modest-length skirts or dresses (no shorter than the uniform skirt), or appropriately fitting dress slacks; bare midriffs are not acceptable.
- Modestly-cut sleeveless tops/dresses are allowed; ladies may not wear strapless, spaghetti-strap, or tank tops.

- Girls should wear dress shoes. No flip-flops, no dyed hair.

**In addition, for both young men and young women:**

- No “polo” style shirts or t-shirts
- No athletic shoes/sneakers
- No torn clothing
- No see-through clothing or clothing that shows midriff
- No khakis, jeans/denim, or cargo pants
- No shorts
