

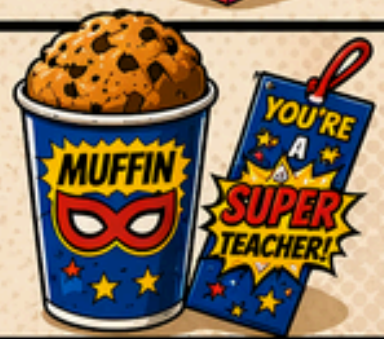

We ask that all athletes dress in Semi-Formal Attire. Please see the dress code below:

Semi-Formal Event Dress Code

Semi-Formal Dress Code for Young Men:

- Dress slacks (no jeans or patched pocket pants), collared dress shirt, dark socks, dress shoes (no sneakers or sandals), no dyed hair or hats.
- Boys may wear modest, professional ties without images or logos.
- Hair should be trimmed appropriately.

Semi-Formal Dress Code for Young Women:

- Modest-length skirts or dresses (no shorter than the uniform skirt), or appropriately fitting dress slacks; bare midriffs are not acceptable.
- Modestly cut sleeveless tops/dresses are allowed; ladies may not wear strapless, spaghetti-strap, or tank tops.
- Girls should wear dress shoes. No flip-flops, no dyed hair.

In addition, for both young men and young women:

- No "polo" style shirts or t-shirts
- No athletic shoes/sneakers
- No torn clothing
- No see-through clothing or clothing that shows the midriff
- No khakis, jeans/denim, or cargo pants
- No shorts
- No hats or head coverings such as bandanas or doo rags

Bus Leaves Classical Prep: Friday, May 1, at 12:30 PM

Bus Returns to Classical Prep: Saturday, May 2, at 2:00 AM

This Friday, May 1, is Gradventure! We are excited to take our 8th-grade scholars who signed up for this event to Universal Studios. Scholars will receive their tickets on the morning of the trip; annual passes are not valid for this event.

Scholars attending the trip are expected to attend school in the morning prior to departure. We strongly encourage them to rest on the bus ride to the park and sleep on the return trip to help ensure a safe and comfortable experience.

Please review the important trip details below:

Where: Universal Orlando

When: Friday, May 1, 2026

Departure Time: Charter bus leaves at 12:30 PM

Return Time: The charter bus is expected to return to Classical Prep at approximately 2:00 AM

What to Bring:

- A water bottle or a refillable water bottle
- Cell phones are permitted (please ensure scholars bring a charger or portable charger so they can contact you upon arrival back near campus for pick-up)
- Money for food and/or the gift shop (one meal voucher will be provided to each scholar)
 - Universal does not accept cash payments; only card or digital wallet payments are accepted.
- A ziplock bag for electronic items when riding water attractions
- Any bags or purses must be no larger than 8.5" x 5.5" (half sheet of paper), including drawstring backpacks (all bags are subject to inspection before entering the park)
- No outside food, beverages, or coolers are permitted inside Universal Parks

Dress Code:

Universal Orlando enforces a strict dress code for this event. The park reserves the right to deny entry or require the purchase of appropriate clothing if guidelines are not followed (see PDF on page 12 for details).

Scholars are required to wear their 8th Grade shirt (if purchased earlier in the year) or a purple shirt.

Dress Code

All schools should conduct their own security and dress code screening prior to departing for Gradventure.

OK

ACCEPTABLE ATTIRE

- Dresses, skirts, capris or shorts
- Casual pants (including jeans)
- Casual blouses and tops with sleeves
- Comfortable shoes (including tennis shoes, dress sandals, boots & flip-flops)
- Hats
- Any bags and purses must be under the size of 8.5" x 5.5" (half a sheet of paper) including drawstring backpacks
- Drawstring bags
- Loungefly style backpacks
- Casual pants (including khakis)
- Shirts with sleeves (polos, dress and t-shirts)

NOT OK

UNACCEPTABLE ATTIRE

- Clothing with holes or shredding
- Clothing with obscene, offensive language or graphics
- Visible undergarments
- Tank tops, sleeveless tops, & undershirts
- Clothing that exposes excessive portions of the skin that may be viewed as inappropriate at a school function (e.g., bikini tops and bottoms)
- Short shorts must be no shorter than mid-thigh
- Area codes displayed on clothing
- Accessories such as chains, spiked collars or studded/spiked belts
- Bandanas
- Selfie sticks
- Large backpacks

IT IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED THAT STUDENTS WEAR MATCHING, BRIGHTLY COLORED SHIRTS WITH THEIR SCHOOL CLEARLY IDENTIFIED ON THEM.

Universal Orlando reserves the right to refuse entry into the event or require the purchase of appropriate clothing for non-compliance with the dress code.
